Accommodations Guide: Students

WHAT IS THE INTERACTIVE ACCOMMODATIONS PROCESS?

The Interactive Accommodations Process is a conversation between a student with a disability and Accessibility Services staff to determine reasonable accommodations for a student's self-disclosed disability.

WHY WOULD A STUDENT WITH A DISABILITY PARTICIPATE IN THE INTERACTIVE ACCOMMODATIONS PROCESS?

By participating in the Interactive Accommodations Process, a student with a disability actively explores and requests potential support, such as accommodations, to have an equitable educational experience.

ARE ACCOMMODATIONS ONLY AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS WITH A DOCUMENTED DISABILITY?

Documentation is not required to apply for accommodations; however, it may be needed at a later date. Visit Accessibility Services within the Learning Center to discuss available options.

IS THIS A CONFIDENTIAL PROCESS?

Yes. When a request for accommodations is approved, the appropriate faculty members will be notified of the accommodations, but they will not be notified of the disabilities unless requested by the student.
