

Dear Faculty,

Happy New Year! I hope your break was restful and that you were able to slow down and enjoy time with your family and friends.

This spring we are implementing the option for adjuncts to request <u>Academic-Year Appointments</u> beginning with the 2024-2025 academic year.

Adjunct Faculty are eligible to request an Academic-Year Appointment from their department Chair or Director if they meet the following conditions: 1) Qualify as, or are current, members of SEIU, and 2) have taught undergraduate BFA or graduate MFA level credit-earning courses at MCAD for the prior four consecutive semesters, inclusive of the current semester but excluding Summer Term.

If eligible, please submit this <u>form</u> no sooner than the first week of classes and no later than the sixth week of classes of the Spring 2024 semester. Chairs and/or Directors of the programs will review the requests and make recommendations to the VPAA.

PRIORITY DEADLINES

Spring 2024 Add/Drop Period: Tuesday 1/16 - Monday 1/22 at 5:00 p.m.

The Spring Semester 2024 Add/Drop will begin on Tuesday, January 16, and will end at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 22. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Registration tab of myMCAD. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient. All adds or drops must be completed using this form. Students can contact their chair with any enrollment questions.

Class Attendance Verification Forms Due Friday, January 26

Class Attendance Verification Forms are due on Friday, January 26. Please fill out one form for each section you are teaching. These forms are not optional. Information should reflect attendance as of the first class meeting, and you should file these forms ASAP after your first class meeting with the attendance information from that session. These forms are important for Records to verify registrations and follow up promptly on any enrollment discrepancies. You can find the form on myMCAD on the Faculty Info tab. January's Book is: About A Field Guide to Getting Lost:

Here is a brief description from the New Yorker.

This meditation on the pleasures and terrors of getting lost is—as befits its subject—less a coherent argument than a series of peregrinations, leading the reader to unexpected vistas. The word "lost," Solnit informs us, derives from the Old Norse for disbanding an army, and she extrapolates from this the idea of striking "a truce with the wide world." It's the wideness of the world that entices: a map of this deceptively slender volume would include hermit crabs, who live in scavenged shells; marauding conquistadors; an immigrant grandmother committed to an asylum; white frontier children kidnapped by Indians; and Hitchcock's "Vertigo." Solnit imagines a long-distance runner accumulating moments when neither foot is on the ground, "tiny fragments of levitation," and argues, by analogy, that in relinquishing certainty we approach, if only fleetingly, the divine.

Artist-in-Residence Program at the CBS Conservatory

The College of Biological Sciences at the University of Minnesota, through the CBS Conservatory & Botanical Collection and Cedar Creek Ecosystem Science Reserve, offers a diversity of plant and animal communities and a wealth of long-term ecological and botanical research. In a new partnership, Cedar Creek and the Conservatory are teaming up to provide a unique opportunity for artists to investigate the intersection of science, nature, and humanity. We invite artists working in any genre (including but not limited to photography, painting, music, creative writing...) to bring their unique ideas and perspectives to Cedar Creek and/or the Conservatory to help us build a long-term, diverse body of work exploring these spaces and their science.

Artists in residence are provided with:

- Access to a world-renowned research site and/or botanical collection and the diverse habitats, biomes, and experiments they contain for up to one year
- Opportunities to interact with researchers and students working onsite, including formal meetings, opportunities to observe and/or participate in fieldwork, horticulture, etc
- Space to promote your project on the Cedar Creek and/or CBS Conservatory website and social media platforms as well as in the Cedar Creek main visitors building or the Plant Growth Facilities in St. Paul
- Access to a private one-bedroom house on the property for overnight stays, if desired (for Cedar Creek residencies only)
- A one-time \$1000 honorarium, to be paid in two installments during the residency

Submit your proposal <u>here</u>. Applications will be accepted until January 17, 2024. Applicants will be notified of their status by early February.

<u>Jessica M. Dandona Publishes Article in Journal of the Scottish Society for Art History</u>

Dr. Jessica M. Dandona (Professor, Liberal Arts) has published an article entitled "The "Art" of Anatomy: The Case of Andrew Melville Paterson in Dundee, 1888–1894" in the journal of the Scottish Society for Art History, No. 28 (2023–24). Dr. Dandona's article looks at the intersecting histories of art and anatomical study, examining the origins and material dimensions of their shared reliance on the plaster cast as a teaching tool.

Sam Gould's New Essay Collection

Sam Gould has released a collection of essays. <u>America Composes Itself</u> is the title of the book containing their writings throughout the 2010s decade. A recipient of a <u>2014 McKnight Foundation Visual Arts Fellowship</u> and a 2017 McKnight Foundation Mid-Career grant, Gould's writings examine topics and histories challenging our political, psychological, and physical terrains.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 12-6-23

We began with a check-in around the room. Brief updates were shared related to the Paper Studio remediation, updates on the Faculty Development Day plans, and a reminder that fall commencement on Friday, December 8. We then had work-in-progress presentations from Design on their work integrating Furniture and Product Design into a singular program and from Media Arts on the creation of a transdisciplinary program including Photography, Film, and Web and Multimedia. We concluded with a discussion of the Coursework Archive and the process of archiving student work from courses at the end of the semester. This was the final meeting of the fall semester.
