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PRIORITY DEADLINES

Spring 2022 Add/Drop Period: Tuesday 1/18 - Monday 1/24 at 5:00 p.m.

Spring Semester 2022 Add/Drop will begin on Tuesday, January 18 and will end at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 24. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Records Office tab of mymcad. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient—all adds or drops must be completed using this form.

Please note that waitlists are not being maintained at this time for any sections, and any students wishing to join a section must follow the Add/Drop process. Contact your chair or program director with any enrollment questions.

The deadline for students to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms is 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 24. Forms will not be available on myMCAD after the deadline. Course adds will not be permitted after the deadline, and course drops after the deadline will count as withdrawals, which remain on the record with a grade of W and involve a withdrawal fee.

Direct students wishing to add or drop your section(s) to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms on <u>myMCAD</u> prior to the deadline.

Sign up for the Self-Paced Priming the Canvas workshop

Get primed for teaching with Canvas, MCAD's Learning Management System. All faculty are expected to use the Canvas learning management system for their courses. The self-paced workshop should take about 2-4 hours to complete. Topics include: navigating Canvas, course templates, uploading and organizing course materials, grading, collecting work with assignments and discussions, online quizzes/tests, communication tools, video creation with Canvas Studio, and more.
