Aruna D'Souza is a writer and critic based in New York. She is a regular contributor to *The New York Times* and 4Columns.org, where she is a member of the editorial advisory board. Her writing has also appeared in the *Wall Street Journal*, CNN.com, *Bookforum*, *Frieze*, *Momus*, and *Art in America*, among other places. Her book, *Whitewalling: Art, Race, and Protest in 3 Acts* (Badlands Unlimited), was named one of the best art books of 2018 by *the New York Times*. PRIORITY DEADLINES.

Spring 2025 Add/Drop Period: Jan 21 - Jan 27, 2025

Spring Semester 2025 Add/Drop will begin at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, January 21. Students will be able to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms on myMCAD until 11:59 p.m. on Monday, January 27. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Registration tab of myMCAD. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient. All adds or drops must be completed using this form. Contact your chair with any enrollment questions.

The deadline for students to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms is 11:59 p.m. on Monday, January 27. Forms will not be available on myMCAD after the deadline. Course adds WILL NOT be permitted after the deadline, and course drops after the deadline will count as withdrawals, which remain on the record with a grade of W and involve a withdrawal fee.

Class Attendance Verification Forms Due: Friday, January 31, 2025

Class Attendance Verification Forms are due on Friday, January 31. Please fill out one form for each section you are teaching. These forms are not optional. Information should reflect attendance as of the first class meeting, and you should file these forms ASAP after your first class meeting with the attendance information from that session. These forms are important for Records to verify registrations and follow up promptly on any enrollment discrepancies. You can find the form on myMCAD on the Faculty Info tab.

The Lyndale Park Rose Garden is the second oldest public rose garden in the United States located on Lake Harriet in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The collage will be up during Spring 2025.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Cabinet 12-11-24

We began with a check-in around the room. The VPAA gave brief updates on searches including the President, Chair of Media Arts, and Full-time Faculty in Product and Furniture Design. Ema Thoen joined to discuss the junior review schedule for the spring semester. We approved the curricular change process policy. Program leaders shared reflections on conversations they have had with their faculty on how artificial intelligence impacts their disciplines and how they have chosen to engage. This was a rich discussion and we will continue to explore AI at MCAD, with program leaders and faculty taking the lead to identify what they believe is appropriate (or not) within their discipline.
