Updates to Service Bureau Turnaround Times and Rush Fees

Based on what we've learned over the last two years, the SB has made some significant updates to its Turnaround Times. Please keep these times in mind when scheduling assignments. The biggest changes are:

-ImagePress prints are now a 1 Day turnaround time item. Remember that basic BW and Color prints can be made 24/7 with the public printers in the main building and in the Library.

-All binding and finishing services (which includes perfect bound books and booklets) are now a 2 Day turnaround time

item.

Most of the time we finish orders well in advance but you and your students should use these for planning and expectation purposes.

We are also eliminating the option of "RUSH" orders and fees for all services. We have made this decision in the interest of reducing student expenses and streamlining our internal production schedule.

Finally, please <u>schedule</u> an appointment with us for a class visit or consultation to schedule and coordinate your assignments.

Print Paper Book Professor, Natasha Pestich, received a Creative Support for Individuals grant from the Minnesota State Arts Board for a solo exhibition and related programming that will take place at the Hutchinson Center for Arts in September 2022.
Jessica M. Dandona selected as M. C. Lang Fellow in Book History, Bibliography, and Humanities Teaching with Historical Sources (2022–23), Rare Book School (Charlottesville, VA)
Liberal Arts Professor, Jessica M. Dandona, will participate in the M. C. Lang Fellowship in Book History, Bibliography, and Humanities Teaching with Historical Sourcesm a two-year program designed to animate humanities teaching and equip educators (both library/curatorial staff and tenured or tenure-track faculty) to enlarge their students' historical sensibilities through bibliographically informed instruction with original historical sources. The ultimate goal of this program is to re-seed American colleges and small universities with humanities teachers who make maximal use of special collections resources in their undergraduate courses, so that the integration of bibliographical and bookhistorical sensibilities becomes woven into the fabric of such teaching.
