# PRIORITY DEADLINES

#### February 26th Deadline for Adjunct Academic-Year Appointments 2024-2025

Adjunct Faculty are eligible to request an Academic-Year Appointment from their department Chair or Director if they meet the following conditions: 1) Qualify as, or are current, members of SEIU, and 2) have taught undergraduate BFA or graduate MFA level credit-earning courses at MCAD for the prior four consecutive semesters, inclusive of the current semester but excluding Summer Term.

If eligible, please submit this <u>form</u> by Monday, February 26th. Chairs and/or Directors of the programs will review the requests and make recommendations to the VPAA.

#### Accessibility in the Arts Series

The Accessibility in the Arts Series provides an in-depth look at accessible design as it pertains to an art and design practice. All of the toolkits in this series follow the same format. We engage with color, sound, visual media, etc. through an accessibility lens, chat about strategies you (or your students) can embed in your own practice, and end with recommendations for making accessibility a larger conversation within your class. Our semester starts off with accessible color theory. Updates are planned about once a month throughout the term.

### New Artist Residency and Exchange in Fergus Falls, MN

Springboard for the Arts has a new artist residency and exchange in Fergus Falls, MN by the name of Falls Community Arts Exchange. It is open to artists, creatives, culture bearers, community leaders, or travelers who want to experience the local arts community of Otter Tail County.

They are now accepting applications for the Artist Track of the exchange. This career development track is for individual artists interested in deep exchange with rural creative ecosystems, and who are interested in completing a collaborative project that supports local community goals through creative engagement. Visiting artists receive a \$4,500 stipend and spend 4 weeks living in Fergus Falls, where they receive support and coaching from Springboard staff, connect with local artists, and work on a modest collaborative project with a local organization.

The application closes at midnight CST on March 21.

#### 2023 McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship Application Now Open

The McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship program rewards Minnesota visual artists whose work is of exceptional artistic merit and who have created a substantial body of work to be at a career stage beyond emerging. This year a total of six \$25,000 fellowships will be awarded. In addition, the Visual Artist fellows will have the opportunity to meet with five visiting national critics, to participate in a McKnight Discussion Series that features fellows and invited critics, to attend a 1–2 week artist residency through Artists Community Alliance (ACA), and to use additional funds for individualized professional development activities.

The deadline to <u>apply</u> is Friday, March 22 at 12:00 p.m.

#### 2025 Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship

This Fellowship supports artists working in Dance; Film, Video and Digital Production; Literature; Music; Technology Centered Arts; Theater/Performance/Spoken Word; and Visual Arts, who embrace their roles as part of a larger community of artists and citizens, and consciously work with a sense of service and responsibility.

Support is directed to early career artists, which Jerome Foundation defines as within the 2nd–10th year as a generative artist. Fellows receive \$60,000 over three consecutive years (\$20,000 each year) to support time and expenses for the creation of new work, artistic development, and/or professional artistic career development. The Foundation expects to award a total of 45 fellowships across 7 artistic fields.

The application is now open. The deadline is Monday, April 15 by 4:00 p.m. Central time/5:00 p.m. Eastern time.

## ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

#### Cabinet 1-7-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Robert shared that Diane Ragsdale's family donated her library to MCAD and that the books have now been moved and the library staff is currently sorting through them. They will make up the Diane Elizabeth Ragsdale Collection. Communications and Marketing Strategy requested that we remind chairs and directors that student work is requested to highlight on our website and other associated promotional material. Steven Candy set up a google drive with folders for all departments to contribute material. We reviewed all new course proposals, along with changes to existing courses and course retirements. In addition, we reviewed adjusted program planning sheets (Product Design, Curatorial Studies minor, Experimental Games minor, and Creative Entrepreneurship/MA in Sustainable Design dual degree). Time was provided for questions and feedback on all course/program changes. 10-day stats were presented by Jim Howley and Melissa Rands, showing a 10.68%

undergraduate decline from the fall enrollment numbers and substantive increase in MA graduate enrollments, including a 27% increase in the MA in Graphics and Web Design. A more granular look at first year students will be presented at the next meeting.

#### Curriculum 2-14-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Jim Howley led a follow-up discussion on the qualitative responses to the SNAAP (Strategic National Arts Alumni Project) survey from 2022. Conversation focused on Career Development, resources after commencement, uneven support across majors, debt and how to better communicate resources to all students and alumni. Jim reminded the group to review the Institutional Learning Outcomes and add comments/suggestions to the shared document. Jen Zuccola shared details related to first year students who did not return to MCAD this spring including mental health, financial and academic challenges. Students in the First Year Experience course retained at higher numbers. Reminders related to programs chairs and directors that the final fall curriculum is due on February 27.

#### Made at MCAD 2024: All-Student Juried Exhibition

All current MCAD students (all degrees and all divisions) are invited to participate in the Made at MCAD 2024 call for art. This annual juried exhibition features the best work submitted by current MCAD students pursuing all degrees in design, fine arts, media arts, and entrepreneurial studies. Participants have a chance to win five \$250 cash prizes.

Each student can submit up to three individual/collaborative works or one series of up to eight pieces. The work submitted must have been done while enrolled as a student at MCAD. Any medium, including time-based works (e.g., film, video, websites, and animation), is acceptable.
