Regan Golden depicts ecological change in the American landscape using drawing materials and altered photographs. Golden's collages and cut-paper installations have been exhibited in solo and group shows at Harvard University's Fisher Forestry Museum, The Cue Foundation in New York City, The Soo Visual Art Center in Minneapolis, and The Midwest Photographers Project at the Museum of Contemporary Photography in Chicago. Golden has received numerous grants and fellowships, including The Core Program Fellowship in Critical Studies at the Museum of Fine Arts Houston, The Joan Mitchell Foundation MFA Grant and a Long-term Ecological Research Grant in the Arts from The National Science Foundation. Golden is a 2020/21 recipient of the MN State Arts Board Creative Support for Individuals Grant and the Next Step Fund Grant. As a writer, Golden focuses on how urban landscapes are seen and experienced, her recent publications are "Collage As A Way of Living" in MARCH: Journal of Art & Strategy and "Seeing Plants: Vision and Botany in Contemporary Art" in MnArtists/Walker Art Center Online Magazine. Golden received a BA in History & Studio Art from Grinnell College and an MFA in Painting & Drawing from the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. She currently teaches at the University of Minnesota and the Minneapolis College of Art & Design.

Through her research-based practice, Claudia O'Steen examines navigation, exploration, perception, and the experience of being lost. She creates landscapes supplemented by scientific curiosity and human memory and invents languages to convey distance, scale, and direction, giving evidence to a process that has taken place.
