Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant

Application for the Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant for the 2024-2025 academic year is now open. There is a total of \$20,000 to grant, with a maximum of \$2000 to be granted to individual faculty. <u>Please see the full specifications with eligibility and application requirements</u>.

The purpose of the Faculty Support Grants is to provide financial support for faculty projects and research. Faculty engaged in artistic production, research, and dialogue contribute richly to the fabric of the College and the educational experiences of our students as well as the larger community.

Grant amounts will be based on budget requests of any amount with a maximum of \$2000 per proposal. Faculty can apply annually. PLEASE NOTE: Continuing for the 2024-2025 grant cycle, awards will be disbursed through payroll, and taxes/benefits will be deducted before faculty receive their funds, so plan your budget accordingly – This section of the guidelines has been expanded in greater detail.

Towards Better Tools: Shaping the Future of AI for the Arts and Design in Higher Education Webinar

On Friday, April 5, from 11:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m., AICAD and ICFAD invite their shared communities to participate in a panel discussion envisioning more productive, equitable, and artful futures for the use of AI in arts and design higher education. New Artist Residency and Exchange in Fergus Falls, MN

Springboard for the Arts has a new artist residency and exchange in Fergus Falls, MN by the name of Falls Community Arts Exchange. It is open to artists, creatives, culture bearers, community leaders, or travelers who want

to experience the local arts community of Otter Tail County.

They are now accepting applications for the Artist Track of the exchange. This career development track is for individual artists interested in deep exchange with rural creative ecosystems and interested in completing a collaborative project that supports local community goals through creative engagement. Visiting artists receive a \$4,500 stipend and spend 4 weeks living in Fergus Falls, where they receive support and coaching from Springboard staff, connect with local artists, and work on a modest collaborative project with a local organization.

The application closes at midnight CST on March 21.

2023 McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship Application Now Open

The McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship program rewards Minnesota visual artists whose work is of exceptional artistic merit and who have created a substantial body of work to be at a career stage beyond emerging. This year a total of six \$25,000 fellowships will be awarded. In addition, the Visual Artist fellows will have the opportunity to meet with five visiting national critics, participate in a McKnight Discussion Series that features fellows and invited critics, attend a 1– 2 week artist residency through Artists Community Alliance (ACA), and to use additional funds for individualized professional development activities.

The deadline to <u>apply</u> is Friday, March 22 at 12:00 p.m.

2025 Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship

This Fellowship supports artists working in Dance; Film, Video, and Digital Production; Literature; Music; Technology Centered Arts; Theater/Performance/Spoken Word; and Visual Arts, who embrace their roles as part of a larger community of artists and citizens, and consciously work with a sense of service and responsibility.

Support is directed to early career artists, which Jerome Foundation defines as within the 2nd–10th year as a generative artist. Fellows receive \$60,000 over three consecutive years (\$20,000 each year) to support time and expenses for the creation of new work, artistic development, and/or professional artistic career development. The Foundation expects to award a total of 45 fellowships across 7 artistic fields.

The application is now open. The deadline is Monday, April 15 by 4:00 p.m. Central time/5:00 p.m. Eastern time.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Cabinet 2-21-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Katherine and Robert led a debrief of the Sherman Fairchild Foundation consultant pre-grant visit to MCAD related to the \$500K art and technology grant. We then discussed consistency of approach and collaborating across departments implementing the Academic Year Appointments for adjunct faculty. Khendum shared details on workshops for faculty from Teaching and Learning Excellence. Jim and Melissa led a conversation on updating the undergraduate exit survey and invited comments from the group to inform possible changes. We discussed the downturn in spring semester enrollments and the impact that it is having on the budget. Jen shared that artist Damon Lock is performing at the Walker Art Center, will be on campus Friday, April 19th, and is interested in engaging classes/faculty/students. If there is interest from your faculty, please reach out to Jen or Brett in Student Affairs.

Curriculum 2-28-24

We began with a check-in around the room. We discussed the First-Year Experience course and a proposal to offer this to all incoming students as a one-credit offering next fall. The committee unanimously approved the proposal. We then discussed course workload definitions and reminded leaders to remind faculty that most of our students take five (or more) courses each term and the need to keep work expectations in line with institutional definitions. Classroom behavior also came up concerning screens, headphones, and more. The Teaching and Learning workshop on student engagement will address some strategies for confronting these issues. Robert led a conversation regarding the budget and the email from the President. All areas in Academic Affairs that had any reduction in their budget had already been communicated with individually to ensure minimal impact. He shared that he met with all support area leaders the day before to share more information and answer questions. He asked all areas to begin considering their budget for next year and to identify areas they believe could be reduced without thwarting our ability to adhere to academic excellence. We discussed course caps and no longer being able to run courses with low enrollment (with some exceptions, such as Senior Project). We also discussed the over-tally process undertaken with Chairs after registration is complete when we collectively review courses with waitlists and/or are under-enrolled. Acknowledging some concerns raised by Faculty Senate, we will review the history of over-tallied courses in the past couple of years and determine if those course enrollments shifted down during the add/drop period. We will bring this research to the committee next week. Robert made it clear that at this time we are not raising course caps across the curriculum for next year. Jim reminded everyone to make comments on the Institutional Learning Outcomes documents and that all programs should be working on their assessment project this year in anticipation of presenting this work during May Days.
