All Summer and Fall 2021 Textbook & Materials information is due Friday, March 26

Now is the time for faculty to start thinking about materials and textbooks for Summer and Fall 2021 classes.

To help students plan financially for their upcoming semester, it is important that we notify them of all textbooks and materials costs at the time of registration. Therefore, we ask that all faculty complete the Textbook and Materials form for every class you are teaching in Spring 2021, even if you are not requiring any textbooks and/or materials (there will be an opt-out checkbox in the form).

Additionally, your materials list should include everything that you will be requiring students to purchase for your course, and the total estimated cost. A range for the estimate (e.g. \$50 - \$100) is fine. Staff in the Art Cellar are available to help you with calculating costs anytime between 10-4, Monday through Friday.

You will receive a follow-up email with instructions for completing the Textbook & Material submission form closer to registration.
