Please submit Spring 2024 midterm grades in <u>myMCAD</u> before Tuesday, March 26 at 9 p.m. Midterm grading in <u>myMCAD</u> is required, and midterm grades are crucial progress indicators for students, advisors, and support staff.

Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant

Application for the Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant for the 2024-2025 academic year is now open. There is a total of \$20,000 to grant, with a maximum of \$2000 to be granted to individual faculty. Please see the full specifications with eligibility and application requirements.

The purpose of the Faculty Support Grants is to provide financial support for faculty projects and research. Faculty engaged in artistic production, research, and dialogue contribute richly to the fabric of the College and the educational experiences of our students as well as the larger community.

Grant amounts will be based on budget requests of any amount with a maximum of \$2000 per proposal. Faculty can apply annually. PLEASE NOTE: Continuing for the 2024-2025 grant cycle, awards will be disbursed through payroll, and taxes/benefits will be deducted before faculty receive their funds, so plan your budget accordingly – This section of the guidelines has been expanded in greater detail.

Towards Better Tools: Shaping the Future of AI for the Arts and Design in Higher Education Webinar

On Friday, April 5, from 11:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m., AICAD and ICFAD invite their shared communities to participate in a panel discussion envisioning more productive, equitable, and artful futures for the use of AI in arts and design higher education. Amid rapid technological development and the anxiety that attends these changes, how can academic and artistic leaders work collectively to proactively shape the continued development of these tools and their deployment in research, teaching, and practice?

New Artist Residency and Exchange in Fergus Falls, MN

Springboard for the Arts has a new artist residency and exchange in Fergus Falls, MN by the name of Falls Community Arts Exchange. It is open to artists, creatives, culture bearers, community leaders, or travelers who want to experience the local arts community of Otter Tail County.

They are now accepting applications for the Artist Track of the exchange. This career development track is for individual artists interested in deep exchange with rural creative ecosystems and interested in completing a collaborative project that supports local community goals through creative engagement. Visiting artists receive a \$4,500 stipend and spend 4 weeks living in Fergus Falls, where they receive support and coaching from Springboard staff, connect with local artists, and work on a modest collaborative project with a local organization.

The <u>application</u> closes at midnight CST on March 21.

2023 McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship Application Now Open

The McKnight Visual Artist Fellowship program rewards Minnesota visual artists whose work is of exceptional artistic merit and who have created a substantial body of work to be at a career stage beyond emerging. This year a total of six \$25,000 fellowships will be awarded. In addition, the Visual Artist fellows will have the opportunity to meet with five visiting national critics, participate in a McKnight Discussion Series that features fellows and invited critics, attend a 1–2 week artist residency through Artists Community Alliance (ACA), and to use additional funds for individualized professional development activities.

The deadline to apply is Friday, March 22 at 12:00 p.m.

2025 Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship

This Fellowship supports artists working in Dance; Film, Video, and Digital Production; Literature; Music; Technology Centered Arts; Theater/Performance/Spoken Word; and Visual Arts, who embrace their roles as part of a larger community of artists and citizens, and consciously work with a sense of service and responsibility.

Support is directed to early career artists, which Jerome Foundation defines as within the 2nd–10th year as a generative artist. Fellows receive \$60,000 over three consecutive years (\$20,000 each year) to support time and expenses for the creation of new work, artistic development, and/or professional artistic career development. The Foundation expects to award a total of 45 fellowships across 7 artistic fields.

The application is now open. The deadline is Monday, April 15 by 4:00 p.m. Central time/5:00 p.m. Eastern time.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Cabinet 3-6-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Robert shared an acknowledgment of Academic Affairs Assistant Coordinator, Kiley Van Note, who is departing MCAD for a new role at the Nature Conservancy, and her many contributions over the last thirteen years. Everyone was reminded about upcoming admissions events and the importance of faculty and chair participation. We had a robust conversation related to excused absences. The U of

M's policy was shared and many weighed in on the pros and cons of an explicit policy. Pass/fail designations came up in regard to the foundation year. This will be an ongoing topic of discussion going forward. We then discussed registration and the "tally day" process of attending to wait lists, under-enrolled courses, and over-tallying. Historic data was shared from the last two academic years showing official course enrollment limits, the number of over-tallied students at registration, and final enrollment after drop/add. Of the 80 sections of courses that were over-tallied during this period (F22-SP24), only 17 sections remained enrolled over the official enrollment limit (eleven sections with one over-tally; five with two over-tallies; and one with three). We will continue to monitor this and program leaders will clarify the process with faculty. Robert shared that the undergraduate representative from the Student Union to the board raised the topic of department town halls and their value – they were advocating for more of these that include faculty as well. Jim shared the final iteration of institutional learning outcomes with the group.
