

Printing for Faculty and Staff

Faculty and staff printing accounts are associated with a shared department account by default. This means that when you hit print, your department is charged for that print job automatically! Your department head will receive a monthly report of all public printing charges.

Personal printing can be charged to your personal PaperCut account manually by SB staff once you have put money in your account. See this link for adding funds to your Papercut account.

The easiest way to get personal print jobs made is to email your order to the SB!

If you already have or are planning to frequently make your prints on any of the public printers or in the DPL (for example you're printing a photo project in the DPL) you can email the SB with the details of the prints (date/time/filename) and we can re-allocate those charges to your personal PaperCut account.

If you need to print something that should be charged to a department other than your regular one (i.e., Faculty Senate), you will need to email those files to the Service Bureau (service_bureau@mcad.edu) for output so we can manually bill the appropriate department.

All full-service print jobs should be submitted with an appropriate order form.

Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant

Application for the Faculty Senate Professional Development Grant for the 2024-2025 academic year is now open. There is a total of \$20,000 to grant, with a maximum of \$2000 to be granted to individual faculty. Please see the full specifications with eligibility and application requirements.

The purpose of the Faculty Support Grants is to provide financial support for faculty projects and research. Faculty engaged in artistic production, research, and dialogue contribute richly to the fabric of the College and the educational experiences of our students as well as the larger community.

Grant amounts will be based on budget requests of any amount with a maximum of \$2000 per proposal. Faculty can apply annually. PLEASE NOTE: Continuing for the 2024-2025 grant cycle, awards will be disbursed through payroll, and taxes/benefits will be deducted before faculty receive their funds, so plan your budget accordingly – This section of the guidelines has been expanded in greater detail.

The application process is carried out through Submittable. See here to access the application form. Deadline for applications is Friday, April 19, 2024, at 11:59 PM.


more specific professional help that is beyond the scope of your role. In these cases, students should be referred to the services provided by the MCAD Counseling and Wellness Staff.

FACULTY ACTIVITIES

Jessica M. Dandona publishes chapter in Myth and (Mis)Information

Jessica M. Dandona's chapter "Dissecting Venus: Popular Consumption of Flap Anatomies, 1890-1910" appears in Myth and (Mis)information: Constructing the medical professions in eighteenth- and nineteenth-century English literature and culture (Manchester University Press, 2024). The chapter explores how so-called "flap anatomies," including the widely circulated Dr. Minder's Anatomical Manikin (ca. 1900), offered readers the opportunity to engage in a virtual dissection as they folded back the layers of the body to reveal its inner structure. Such works, Dr. Dandona argues, created a shared understanding of the human body defined by the conventions of anatomy, thereby reinforcing the authority of medical discourse. At the same time, they offered lay audiences—and women readers in particular—access to detailed and comprehensive knowledge on controversial topics such as human reproduction.



Gudrun Lock Shoreham Repository archive

Recently acquired by the Hennepin County Library's James K. Hosmer Special Collections department, the experimental archive focuses on the interstitial world of the buffers of Shoreham Yards in Northeast Minneapolis. Created and compiled by artist Gudrun Lock between 2019 and 2023, the repository houses exhibition ephemera, corporate reports, data sets, maps, illustrations, photographs, artworks, personal notes and observations, books, a Dakota language poem, a short experimental film, plant pressings, four pairs of degraded men's underpants, and found objects such as rocks, seed pods and debris. Work made or collected by 17 collaborators, including faculty members Janet Lobberecht, Leslie Grant, Kathryn Savage and Elizabeth Workman is included. The archive is now open to the public during Special Collection hours and should be active in the database as of the end of March 2024.



Elisabeth Workman Receives a 2024 Mn Artists Arts Writing Fellowship

Mn Artists, a critical writing platform of the Walker Art Center, named Elisabeth Workman and aegor ray their 2024 Arts Writing Fellows. Elisabeth's most recent publications for the platform include an essay on Alexa Horochowski's "<u>Under the Sea-Wind</u>" and "<u>Shoreham Repository: A Feralegium</u>", on Gudrun Lock's new archive in the Special Collections at the Minneapolis Central Library.

Print Paper Book Faulty and Area Coordinator, Natasha Pestich, is exhibiting printed works on handmade paper produced during her 2023 McKnight Fellowship in Printmaking at Highpoint Center for Printmaking in Minneapolis, along with the work of MCAD Alum ('94), Carolyn Swiszcz. The exhibition runs through Friday, April 26th.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 4-3-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Timothy Gardner from the Learning Center and Jen Zuccola led a discussion on accommodations with a focus on better faculty support. There is an uptick in accommodations at MCAD, which is consistent with all of higher education. Timothy shared that this will continue to increase. Students are starting to speak up more (students with autism in particular). The learning center uses a highly interactive process to determine accommodations - a student must disclose, and once they disclose, they have a conversation with them 1:1 and examine their paperwork. These meetings can run 1-3 hours and frequently include family members. We've also been working with some K-12 art school teachers in the area. The letters are the same for everyone and the Learning Center is working to make them

more easily read and understood. If the accommodation does not work in a particular class, faculty can reach out and the Learning Center will work to adjust the accommodation. It was agreed that an updated list of all accommodations will be shared with the academic program leaders and the Learning Center will share more information during their faculty meeting during prep week. We also discussed Timothy presenting on accommodations during Faculty Development Day. Melissa Rands presented a draft of an updated inclement weather policy that outlines a process for faculty at a distance to move a single course online with the permission of their chair or director during inclement weather. This will be brought to the Academic Cabinet for input and final approval. Regarding policies at MCAD, AA is exploring the creation of a "policy library" where all college policies would be housed (online) to provide easy access to all members of the community. We had a conversation about how adjunct faculty are supported in their development and assessment. A focus was on providing better support for new adjuncts to MCAD and how best to achieve this. Departments have different approaches and we are working to identify some best practices that can be shared. Gerald made a work-in-progress presentation from the Liberal Arts on a proposed new BFA in Creative Writing. This was an engaged conversation with ideas surfaced by chairs in Media Arts, Design, and Fine Arts. The Liberal Arts will continue working on this proposal with a target launch in the fall of 2025. Erik raised issues related to students using the vans for personal use and the charges being applied to the department budgets. We will work with Tammra to help revise the process for signing up for van usage bringing clarity/openness to the process. We ended with a question about combining fall and spring commencement ceremonies into May and consolidating all MA graduates into the August ceremony. Graduating seniors in the fall will still have their commencement exhibition in December and will be invited to attend the May Commencement ceremony.
