

"ChatGPT: Hype, Threat or Something Else?" Panel Recording

This was a panel discussion webinar for faculty and staff at **Minnesota Private College Council members**. Three faculty members that have been thinking about the issues raised by ChatGPT spoke to the group and then there will be a facilitated conversation, one where questions will be addressed. **Topics covered**:

- How are ChatGPT's capabilities any different than extant AI tools available with less nefarious names?
- What are its limits? How does this change the way we assign writing if at all? How can we see it?
- How do we respond to this tool overall? Is it a threat? Is it just hype? Does it even matter how we respond?

Inclusive Pedagogy Toolkit: Assessment

This resource from Georgetown University offers concrete suggestions for designing inclusive, antiracist learning environments. Topics include pedagogy, assessment, climate, power and mentorship.

The complete toolkit is useful, and the Assessment chapter provides actionable tips on how to more equitably assess students in your courses.

Inclusive assessment includes considerations of purpose and intent of the practice; clear criteria; motivation and retention; and formative, low-stakes opportunities that allow students to monitor their own progress.

Trauma and Resilience in Higher Education Virtual Conference

This one-day virtual live conference on April 26, 8:30 a.m.—4:30 p.m. explores how every encounter area—from pedagogy to campus safety, advising to financial aid, facilities to college policies and administration—can be informed by recognizing the prevalence of trauma, adversity, and toxic stress and how these impact academic outcomes.

Trauma-informed education describes a perspective or lens through which practices and services are evaluated in view of lived experience, basic neurobiology, as well as research and findings on the power of resilience behaviors and interventions to build progressive, positive outcomes.

Leading trauma researcher/clinician/scholar Dr. Bessel van der Kolk (The Body Keeps the Score) will deliver the morning address grounding the conference in the neurobiology of trauma.

Registration is \$77.50 for professionals and academics attending the conference through their institution or seeking professional development, or a "pay what you can" honor system that allows attendees to set a price affordable for them.

Katherine Turczan Publishes Book on Ukrainian Family Roots

Faculty member Katherine Turczan has just published a book delving into their Ukraine roots. From Where They Came revolves around Turczan rediscovering her Ukrainian family heritage. Her grandfather fought against the Bolsheviks in the Russian Civil War, subsequently fleeing due to the formation of the Soviet Union. In the summer of 1991, against the backdrop of the August coup and the subsequent independence of Ukraine, Katherine, fearing that her roots were disintegrating after the death of her grandfather and her parents' dementia, took a camera to the newly liberated country (hence the book's title) and rediscovered aunts, uncles, and cousins she had only heard of. The book consists of 8 x 10 portraits of her extended Ukrainian family's life.

Karen Wirth to Give Lecture at UW-Milwaukee Event

Karen Wirth will be giving a lecture at the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee. As part of UWM's Ettinger Book Artist Series, Wirth will be talking about her book works, and how books, reading, and language are

common denominators in her works. In addition to working on book art, she has also been behind Minneapolis Light Rail co-designs and the Gail See grand staircase at Open Book in Minneapolis, housing the Minnesota Center for Book Arts, The Loft writing center, and Milkweed Editions.

Ben Moren Expanding Beyond His Ecosystem

Ben Moren will be releasing a <u>book</u> of his work, participating in a discussion series at the Mia, and presenting his work at the Grand Marais Art Colony.

Moren's book <u>Reference Ecosystem: Lost 40</u> is based on his project of the same name, which uses artificially generated forests trained on thousands of images from northern Minnesota's Lost 40 Scientific and Natural Area to find a pathway to digitally re-grow the forest using whatever little present reference materials exist. The project seeks to draw focus on the loss of the growth forest during Minnesota's logging boom, while additionally placing them within the context of the current climate crisis.

In addition to Reference Ecosystem, Moren, along with two other people, will also give a talk at the Minneapolis Institute of Art's Pillsbury Auditorium, as part of the McKnight Visual Artist Discussion Series. Moren will also be exhibiting his work at the Grand Marais Art Colony's summer exhibition Air Openness. A new 16mm film of his Breathing Wilderness, will be installed, as well as his White Oak Listener device.

Heritage Partners with MCAD on Real-World Marketing Challenge

Each year the Intro to Advertising class selects a local organization to partner and brief students on a business challenge. This past school year, Red Wing Heritage was chosen as the real-world client, kicking off the brand assignment with Nancy Rice's class. Students were given a marketing project brief and then brought to Red Wing for an immersive brand experience to fully educate and inspire their concepts.
