PRIORITY DEADLINES

Spring 2024 Requests for Incomplete Grades Due Tuesday, May 7 at 5:00 p.m.

This is a reminder that any Spring Semester 2024 requests for incomplete grades must be submitted to Records no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 7. Requests for incomplete grades are always due on the final day of classes for the semester. Please note that incomplete grades are only possible in certain circumstances. See the <u>Student Handbook</u> for the full policy. Students who are currently on academic probation may not receive incomplete grades. Students who are planning to request an incomplete but have not yet done so should contact their department chair or program director now to begin the approval process. Department chairs/program directors must approve any requests, and then the section faculty must do the same, before the approval is routed to Records. Request forms are available on the <u>Records Intranet page</u> under the Forms for Students heading.

Final Spring 2024 Grades Due Tuesday, May 14 at 12:00 p.m.

Spring Semester 2024 grades are due Tuesday, May 14 at 12:00 p.m. This deadline is firm and there are **no exceptions**. Please plan ahead now so that your grades are submitted on time. Grading on myMCAD is open for faculty as of May 1. Be sure that in myMCAD, in My Faculty Course Center, under View Details, the Term menu is set to 2023-24 - Spring. Printing for Faculty and Staff

Faculty and staff printing accounts are associated with a shared department account by default. This means that when you hit print, your department is charged for that print job automatically! Your department head will receive a monthly report of all public printing charges.

Personal printing can be charged to your personal PaperCut account manually by SB staff once you have put money in your account. See this link for adding funds to your Papercut account.

The easiest way to get personal print jobs made is to email your order to the SB!

If you already have or are planning to frequently make your prints on any of the public printers or in the DPL (for example you're printing a photo project in the DPL) you can email the SB with the details of the prints (date/time/filename) and we can re-allocate those charges to your personal PaperCut account.

If you need to print something that should be charged to a department other than your regular one (i.e., Faculty Senate), you will need to email those files to the Service Bureau (service_bureau@mcad.edu) for output so we can manually bill the appropriate department.

All full-service print jobs should be submitted with an appropriate order form.

In this toolkit, Teaching and Learning Excellence explains the Roll Call Attendance LTI, a tool for managing student attendance integrated into the Canvas Learning Management System. This toolkit covers the setup and operation and discusses some of the important things to consider when deciding how it might fit in your class.

While there are other ways to assess participation and attendance in a classroom, this tool works in a similar way to a traditional paper roster and allows faculty (and students) to track the history of their attendance from the same centralized place in Canvas.


FACULTY ACTIVITIES

Katherine Turczan's exhibition at the Tweed Museum

Katherine Turczan's exhibition, "From Where They Came", Photographs from Ukraine 1991-2008 is on view at the Tweed Museum of Art until August 10, 2024.

<u>Jessica M. Dandona publishes chapter in Myth and (Mis)Information</u>

Jessica M. Dandona's chapter "Dissecting Venus: Popular Consumption of Flap Anatomies, 1890-1910" appears in Myth and (Mis)information: Constructing the medical professions in eighteenth- and nineteenth-century English literature and culture (Manchester University Press, 2024). The chapter explores how so-called "flap anatomies," including the widely circulated Dr. Minder's Anatomical Manikin (ca. 1900), offered readers the opportunity to engage in a virtual dissection as they folded back the layers of the body to reveal its inner structure. Such works, Dr. Dandona argues, created a shared understanding of the human body defined by the conventions of anatomy, thereby reinforcing the authority of medical discourse. At the same time, they offered lay audiences—and women readers in particular—access to detailed and comprehensive knowledge on controversial topics such as human reproduction.



ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 4-17-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Robert provided updates on the Hive elevator repair and that the search for Niky Motekallem's replacement in Academic Affairs concluded successfully. Khendum Gyabak, Senior Director of Teaching and Learning Excellence, conducted a brief demo on how to integrate attendance within Canvas and shared access to a toolkit that can be shared with faculty. Everyone was reminded that Tallies was scheduled for Monday (4/22) to review all course registrations with department leaders. We reviewed the process for Academic Year Appointments for adjunct faculty and the letter that will be included with fall contracts indicating that a spring appointment was approved. Enrollment uncertainty in some areas will result in not all requests being approved, though courses can still be assigned during the normal planning for spring during the fall semester. We concluded with a discussion of the Distinguished Adjunct Faculty nominations from Faculty Senate and one put forward by a department chair.

Cabinet 4-24-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Nathan Young, Grants Manager in Institutional Advancement, visited to introduce himself to the group and share a bit about his work and how he can support ideas for funding to support departments and faculty. Robert provided an update on May Days and that Jim Howley shared a template for assessment work presentations. The draft for an updated Inclement Weather and Instruction policy was discussed and approved. We also discussed the collective draft of revisions to the attendance policy, which program leaders are bringing to the faculty for input. Jim Howley presented on the MPCC Economic and Community Impact Study, which seeks to surface the economic impact of MPCC schools on the regional economy. Jim also presented on his experience at the HLC conference, including the updates to the reaffirmation criteria.
