PRIORITY DEADLINES

August and December 2022 Intents to Graduate Due Tuesday, May 10

The deadline to submit August and December 2022 Intent to Graduate forms is Tuesday, May 10. If you are working with any students who plan to graduate in August (MA only) or December 2022, please remind them to submit this form on <u>myMCAD</u>.

Requests for Spring 2022 Incomplete Grades Due Tuesday, May 10

This is a reminder that any Spring Semester 2022 requests for incomplete grades must be submitted to Records no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 10. Requests for incomplete grades are always due on the final day of classes for the semester. Please note that incomplete grades are only possible in certain circumstances. See the Student Handbook for the full policy. Students who are currently on academic probation may not receive incomplete grades. Students who are planning to request an incomplete but have not yet done so should contact their department chair or program director now to begin the approval process. Department chairs/program directors must approve any requests, and then the section faculty must do the same, before the approval is routed to Records.

Final Spring 2022 Grades Due Tuesday, May 17 at Noon

Spring Semester 2022 grades are due Tuesday, May 17 at noon. Grading on myMCAD is available for faculty as of May 2. Submit Fall 2022 Textbooks and Materials to MyMCAD

All full time faculty can now enter all required textbooks and materials for your Fall 2022 courses to <u>myMCAD</u>. Adjunct faculty can wait to do so until their Fall 2022 courses have been assigned.

The small effort of posting textbooks and materials costs prior to registration provides transparency for students and allows the maximum time for them to financially and logistically prepare for the upcoming semester. When selecting required textbooks and materials for a course, I encourage you to select the best value materials for the lowest cost and work to eliminate any unnecessary course materials.

If necessary, please seek guidance from your department chair or director regarding selecting textbooks and materials for your courses. Department chairs and directors can also provide the required textbooks and materials from previous offerings of the course or help you in determining which educational materials are most appropriate for a given course.

Additionally, the MCAD Art Cellar can provide guidance for selecting and pricing materials for your courses. The Art Cellar is a non-profit, in-house resource for faculty, staff, and students. Open Invitation: Canvas Outcomes Pilot

The Canvas outcome project is a major step in making students' learning visible to them, providing a clear understanding of the direction of their education and giving them the 'why' of an assignment. Students will have more agency over their education by seeing it in a holistic way. For faculty, it will put the focus on the learning and its process, rather than on the final grade, empowering them to focus on their teaching. It works by integrating design practices into the curriculum through reflection and iteration. Participating faculty will receive a \$150 stipend.

2023 Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship application is now open!

Jerome Hill Artist Fellowships support Minnesota and New York City-based artists across 8 artistic fields who generate new work that takes creative risks in expanding, questioning, experimenting with, or re-imagining conventional artistic forms. This Fellowship supports artists who embrace their roles as part of a larger community of artists and citizens, and consciously work with a sense of service, whether aesthetic, social, or both. Support is directed to artists who are at an early point in their careers in creating such work, generally in their 2nd–10th year as a generative artist.

Fellows receive \$50,000 over two consecutive years (\$25,000 each year) to support their time and expenses for the creation of new work, artistic development and/or professional artistic career development.

<u>"Not Here"</u> Exhibition at St. Catherine University

Faculty member Jody Williams has an upcoming solo exhibition at St. Catherine University's Catherine G. Murphy Gallery.

In Not Here, Williams presents drawings, prints, collages, and books, as well as her "not-empty boxes"—intimate, Cabinet of Curiosities-like containers that include elements such as collected specimens, photos, maps, and her own artwork. She will also display illustrated notebooks documenting over 30 years of her travels throughout Minnesota, the United States, and Europe. While the subject matter of her works may seem unrelated, by choosing to bring together the work she has made beyond her Minneapolis studio, Williams relays her realization about the influence and importance of place in her art practice.

The artist explains: "Turning both inwards and outwards to address my own presence and memories of location and place, I have begun including landscape drawings, maps, and photographs with natural and artificial specimens. Using the additional physical evidence, I am able to more fully conjure up my own presence in those places while I also consider the more melancholy aspects of absence and memory."

The exhibit is on view until Sunday, May 22.

The Nature of Shoreham Yards

<u>The Nature of Shoreham Yards</u> is an installation envisioned by a collective of thinkers and makers, on view until May 15th in the Target Studio for Creative Collaboration. The focus is the buffers of Shoreham Yards, an intermodal train and trucking site active since the 1880s that moves 3000 trucks past my house every week. It has a history of industrial pollution and is entangled with the global supply chain. Acting as an aesthetic device and storytelling tool, the

installation currently incorporates data, writing, maps, photographs, taxidermied specimens, and collage to rethink these urban "waste places" and trouble the notion of progress.

MCAD faculty Janet Lobberecht, Leslie Grant, Hallie Bahn, and Sarah Petersen have included or are working on content related to the project and students from the Arts Entrepreneurship department helped to produce some aspects of the installation.
