Requests for Spring 2022 Incomplete Grades Due Tuesday, May 10

This is a reminder that any Spring Semester 2022 requests for incomplete grades must be submitted to Records no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 10. Requests for incomplete grades are always due on the final day of classes for the semester. Please note that incomplete grades are only possible in certain circumstances. See the Student Handbook for the full policy. Students who are currently on academic probation may not receive incomplete grades. Students who are planning to request an incomplete but have not yet done so should contact their department chair or program director now to begin the approval process. Department chairs/program directors must approve any requests, and then the section faculty must do the same, before the approval is routed to Records.

Submit Fall 2022 Textbooks and Materials to MyMCAD

All full time faculty can now enter all required textbooks and materials for your Fall 2022 courses to <u>myMCAD</u>. Adjunct faculty can wait to do so until their Fall 2022 courses have been assigned.

The small effort of posting textbooks and materials costs prior to registration provides transparency for students and allows the maximum time for them to financially and logistically prepare for the upcoming semester. When selecting required textbooks and materials for a course, I encourage you to select the best value materials for the lowest cost and work to eliminate any unnecessary course materials.

Open Invitation: Canvas Outcomes Pilot

The Canvas outcome project is a major step in making students' learning visible to them, providing a clear understanding of the direction of their education and giving them the 'why' of an assignment. Students will have more agency over their education by seeing it in a holistic way. For faculty, it will put the focus on the learning and its process, rather than on the final grade, empowering them to focus on their teaching. It works by integrating design practices into the curriculum through reflection and iteration. Participating faculty will receive a \$150 stipend.

Professor Jessica M. Dandona to Present as Part of <u>Confabulations Series on Art &</u> <u>Medicine</u>

This paper comprises a close look at the material and visual culture of obstetrical training in the late 19th-century North Atlantic world, focusing on the manikins, machines, and models employed in contemporary midwifery courses. Created during a time of growing interest in public health, widespread anxiety over rising infant mortality, and emerging pronatalist policies, these widely produced pedagogical objects provided an interactive, mechanistic, and process- oriented simulacrum of the birthing body. Once purpose-built by individual midwives and physicians, by the latter half of the 19th century, obstetrical teaching devices were mass-produced using durable commercial materials. Examples discussed include obstetrical simulators designed by renowned obstetricians, such as the Budin-Pinard manikin, as well as anatomical models of the female pelvic basin by Auzoux and Tramond.

Such works must be viewed, I suggest, in the context of similarly proliferating forms of two-dimensional media, including the wood engravings, half-tone photographs, and chromolithograph illustrations that filled the pages of treatises on the anatomy of pregnancy and childbirth. Together, such works created a densely saturated visual economy at once focused on and characterized by the act of reproduction in all its forms—both bodily and technological. Efforts to standardize the representation of childbirth through the duplication and dissemination of key images and texts, I will argue, constituted a response to the unpredictability of childbirth itself. Objects employed in obstetrical teaching in this period thus sought to construct a consistent framework of both method and practice, within which the unexpected could be accommodated, managed, and made to signify.

<u>"Not Here"</u> Exhibition at St. Catherine University

Adjunct faculty member, Jody Williams has an upcoming solo exhibition at St. Catherine University's Catherine G. Murphy Gallery.

In Not Here, Williams presents drawings, prints, collages, and books, as well as her "not-empty boxes"—intimate, Cabinet of Curiosities-like containers that include elements such as collected specimens, photos, maps, and her own artwork. She will also display illustrated notebooks documenting over 30 years of her travels throughout Minnesota, the United States, and Europe. While the subject matter of her works may seem unrelated, by choosing to bring together the work she has made beyond her Minneapolis studio, Williams relays her realization about the influence and importance of place in her art practice.

The artist explains: "Turning both inwards and outwards to address my own presence and memories of location and place, I have begun including landscape drawings, maps, and photographs with natural and artificial specimens. Using the additional physical evidence, I am able to more fully conjure up my own presence in those places while I also consider the more melancholy aspects of absence and memory."

The exhibit is on view until Sunday, May 22.
