


Faculty Focus 8.15.23

PRIORITY DEADLINES

Fall 2023 Add/Drop Period: Monday 8/21-Friday 8/25 at 5:00 p.m.

Fall Semester 2023 Add/Drop will begin on Monday, August 21 and will end at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, August 25. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Registration tab of myMCAD. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient. All adds or drops must be completed using this form. Students should contact their chair with any enrollment questions.

Class Attendance Verification Forms Due Friday, September 1

Class Attendance Verification Forms are due on Friday, September 1. Please fill out one form for each section you are teaching. These forms are not optional. Information should reflect attendance as of the first class meeting. These forms are important for Records to verify registrations and follow up promptly on any enrollment discrepancies. Bulletin Boards and Posting Policy

Bulletin boards and other designated posting areas may be used for posting notices. Persons posting notices must use push pins or magnets; staples and tape are not allowed. Postings are valid for two weeks. Persons posting notices are responsible for removing their notices. Boards designated for specific purposes/departments should not be used to post notices. Posting areas should not be used to exhibit artwork. Postings in any of the shared, public spaces (e.g. Main Gallery, elevator bays on first and second floors, stairwells, Concourse areas, etc.) are prohibited. Postings in these areas or postings older than two weeks will be removed and recycled by designated staff members and/or assigned Work Study students.

Parking Lot C Updates

You can now link your MCAD ID to a credit or debit card to make parking in the South Lot much easier. By linking your credit or debit card to your ID, you can now enjoy a streamlined payment system, eliminating the need for physical payment cards. Your MCAD ID will trigger a well-priced, 25-cent hourly rate compared to the normal daily rate of \$6 dollars.

If you follow the <u>instructions</u>, you can swipe your ID card on the HID reader to enter the lot. It will automatically charge your associated credit or debit card. You will need to re enroll your ID every six months. MCAD has implemented robust measures to ensure the safety and confidentiality of your data throughout the payment process.

Faculty Repository in Canvas Dashboard

MCAD faculty now have access in the Canvas Dashboard to their own brand new Faculty Repository. The Faculty Repository is an online space just for you, so you can save, organize, and share your Canvas course materials from one central location.

Learning Journey Library

The Learning Journey Library is a free online resource to help educators implement different pedagogical approaches (e.g. team-based learning, flipped classroom, collaborative learning, etc.). It allows you to browse through nearly 20 learning journeys and filter them according to pedagogy, learning goals, and prep time. It also provides use cases and examples of how other institutions applied these journeys.

Each learning journey details step-by-step how faculties can create fruitful learning experience both synchronously and asynchronously. You can find journeys on facilitating Team Based Learning, flipped

classroom, skills development, stimulating engagement, integrating AI tools, and more. All the journeys are scalable across any course modality, class sizes, and adjustable to your subject domains and available technology.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Academic Cabinet May Days: May 17 & 18

We engaged in an Appreciative Inquiry process during May Days. This included four phases:

Phase 1 – Discover: Inquire - What's working? The Best of what is.

Phase 2 – Dream: What might be? What are we being called to become? Imagine

Phase 3 – Design: What should be? What's next and who will benefit? Innovate

Phase 4 – Deliver: What will be? Implement

This was an opportunity for the group to engage in one-on-one, small group, and large group discussions that were far-reaching, generative, and collaborative in nature. With this diverse group from across the college, it was a rich exchange of ideas amongst colleagues who do not necessarily imagine freely together in this way. Ultimately, small groups were formed around topics of interest and these were further explored, before sharing ideas out for whole group input. Topics included an Art + Ecology Lab/Hub; Systems Integration; Reimagining the Adjunct Model for MA programs Online; Full-Time Faculty in Foundation Studies.

May Days concluded with a discussion of updates needed for the Attendance and Academic Honesty policies.

Cabinet 6-20-23

During the meeting, various subjects were discussed and updates were provided on different matters. The discussion began by acknowledging the resonant May Day activities and notes from the meeting were shared. The importance of the experience and continuing to further explore/imagine together was encouraged.

The focus then shifted to a discussion of the latest drafts of the Attendance and Academic Honesty policies. While the attendance policy had undergone minor changes, the COVID-related attendance policy had been removed entirely. The new Attendance policy was approved by Cabinet and two members of Cabinet agreed to work on a final draft for the Academic Policy, including instances of academic dishonesty related to Al use.

A good portion of time was dedicated to assessment presentations from Liberal Arts, Foundation Studies, MAGWD, and MASD.

Cabinet 7-19-23

Mary Alma Noonan, CFO, visited to discuss the budget. In addition, Brian Braden, the new Comptroller was introduced. Mary Alma's arrival last fall has brought better insights to our budget, resulting in what will be an improved budget creation process. Optimism surrounds the upcoming Fall semester, with steady numbers and improved retention rates for first-year students moving to the second year compared to previous years. In addition, efforts are being made to modernize the financial reporting system using Blackbaud for real time budget access.

An edited and improved Chair/Director Manual was shared. Jim Howley, Director of Accreditation and Assessment presented on upcoming work related to the Higher Learning Commission re-affirmation that will occur in the 2025-26 Academic Year, including the formation of an HLC working group. Jim also reminded the group of the schedule of external reviews this year. The Academic Honesty policy changes (from June) were reviewed and approved. Chairs and Directors were reminded to complete committee assignments with an eye towards the equitable distribution of work across departments.
