

<u>Dr. Jessica M. Dandona participates in Art & the Critical Medical Humanities: Activating the Critical Medical Humanities in/through/with Art Practice Workshop in London</u>

In June, Dr. Dandona attended the workshop Art & the Critical Medical Humanities: Activating the Critical Medical Humanities in/through/with Art Practice held at the Royal College of Art, London. This three-day workshop, intended for contributors to the upcoming volume Art & the Critical Medical Humanities (forthcoming Bloomsbury Critical Interventions in the Medical and Health Humanities, 2025), brought together curators, artists, and art historians from around the globe. According to the organizers, Fiona Johnstone (Durham University), Allison Morehead (Queen's University), and Imogen Wilshire (Lincoln University), the workshop "aimed at fostering dialogue, creating connections and activating new entanglements between art-led practices and the critical medical humanities."

<u>Dr. Jessica M. Dandona presents paper at the International Nineteenth Century Studies Association</u> <u>Inaugural Conference, Durham, UK</u>

In July, Dr. Dandona presented her paper, "The Book of the Body: G.-J. Witkowski and the 19th-Century Flap Anatomy as Body/Text" at the International Nineteenth Century Studies Association Inaugural Conference at Durham University (UK). Dr. Dandona's paper looks at nineteenth-century 'flap anatomies'—layered, printed illustrations of human anatomy that offered readers the opportunity to engage in a virtual dissection as they folded back layered illustrations of the body. Produced in brilliant color and composed of dozens of superimposed images, widely-circulated works such as G.-J. Witkowski's Anatomie iconoclastique (1874–88) decorated the walls of physicians' offices, the desks of medical students, and the bookshelves of middle-class families in Britain, Europe, and the United States.

On Monday, May 13th, the Center for Artistic Activism presented <u>Creative Civic Learning: Faculty-Led Ideas</u> to <u>Strengthen Democracy in 2024</u>, a special online event in partnership with Project Pericles. Fall 2024 Add/Drop Period: Monday 8/26 - Friday 8/30 11:59 p.m.

Fall Semester 2024 Add/Drop will begin on Monday, August 26. Students will be able to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms on myMCAD until 11:59 p.m. on Friday, August 30. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Registration tab of MyMCAD. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient. All adds or drops must be completed using this form. Contact your chair with any enrollment questions.
