I hope you will join the **Community Conversation on Monday, August 29 from 12 noon to 1:00 p.m. CT** with MCAD's Civic Scholar in Residence <u>Paul Bauknight</u>, who is a Minneapolis-based architect and designer. He will share his experiences and insights from his work at the nexus of socio-economic systems and the built environment. During his residency at MCAD, Paul is pursuing the advancement of an innovative and interdisciplinary studio space dedicated to inclusive and equitable community development. **Faculty Development Day is Wednesday, August 24 from 9 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. CT.** Join in person in Auditorium 150 or via <u>Zoom</u>. Lunch will be available in the college center after the morning session at 11:45 a.m.

The morning session will feature a presentation and discussion with creative director and educator, Matt Juzenas from <u>Islands of Brilliance</u>, an educational organization specifically for children and adults on the autism spectrum. Matt Juzenas is a creative director and the Director of Educational content at Islands of Brilliance. He is also an adjunct professor at the Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design (MIAD). His career has been a unique blend of education and creative design. Timothy Gardner, Director of the Learning Center and Disability Services at MCAD, will join Matt for this presentation.

The Faculty Senate afternoon workshop will be focused on trauma-informed education with two colleagues from Macalester College, Karín Aguilar-San Juan, Professor of American Studies, Director of the Jan Serie

Center for Scholarship and Teaching, and Christie Manning, Director of Sustainability and Environmental Studies Faculty Member, Environmental Psychology. They will address topics of trauma in our lives (pandemics, climate, mass-shootings, marginalized populations), environmental psychology, survival vs. learning brain, and discuss tools for non-violent communication as a tool for stopping further (systemic) trauma.

As you will see below, there are many events in the coming weeks at MCAD, along with helpful reminders and links to resources available to you.

## **PRIORITY DEADLINES**

#### Fall 2022 Syllabus Template is Now Available

Class syllabi are due by Friday, August 26. For instructions on how to use the template, please see here.

#### Fall 2022 Add/Drop Period: August 29-September 2 at 5:00 p.m.

Fall Semester 2022 Add/Drop will begin on Monday, August 29 and will end at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 2. Students may add and drop courses within this period, using the Add/Drop Courses Form that they can find on the Records Office tab of <u>myMCAD</u>. The form workflow will request department chair approval for all adds, and will also bring in Financial Aid if students will be reducing credits as a result of any drops. *Verbal permission to add a course is not sufficient--all adds or drops must be completed using this form.* Contact your chair with any enrollment questions.

The deadline for students to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 2. Forms will not be available on <u>myMCAD</u> after the deadline. Course adds will not be permitted after the deadline, and course drops after the deadline will count as withdrawals, which remain on the record with a grade of W and involve a withdrawal fee. Tell students wishing to add or drop your section(s) to submit Add/Drop Courses Forms on <u>myMCAD</u>.

### **Class Attendance Verification Forms Due Friday, September 9**

Class Attendance Verification Forms are due on Friday, September 9. Please fill out one form for each section you are teaching. ## Large 44" Banner Printer Update

The Service Bureau's large 44" banner printer died in late May. A replacement was ordered, but has been delayed due to ongoing supply chain problems related to the COVID pandemic. Epson has not been able to provide an ETA. Until the replacement arrives, the Service Bureau can only accept orders for prints up to 24" wide on Matte, Luster, or transparency film.

The fabric printer is still functional and the Service Bureau will continue to accept orders for any of those media options.

## **New Parking System**

Campus Safety recently implemented a new parking system that will go into effect in late August. This new system replaces the stored value parking cards that were purchased from the Art Cellar. The new system will be available to non-resident students, staff, and faculty while allowing the public to park outside of peak academic times. The parking rate for MCAD members will remain at .25 cents an hour. A new public/visitor parking rate of \$5 for the first hour and \$1 thereafter will be added.

MCAD community members will be given online access to a parking system where you can register a payment-credit/debit card in advance. This will trigger the lower .25 cent parking rate when your college ID card is scanned at the exit gate. Credit cards can be used at the gate but the higher public/visitor parking rate will be applied.

Current parking cards that are still valid may be turned in for any remaining value at a later date. Please watch for information on signing up for the new system and how to redeem any value remaining on existing stored value parking cards (\$5, 10, 20 or 40 cards).

## Jessica M. Dandona Awarded Travel Grant from Duke University's Rubenstein Rare Book & Manuscript Library

Jessica M. Dandona (Professor, Liberal Arts) was recently awarded a travel grant to undertake research in the <u>History of Medicine collections</u> at Duke University's David M. Rubenstein Rare Book & Manuscript Library in Durham, NC. The History of Medicine collection includes over 20,000 monographs, more than 4,000 manuscripts, and an array of photographs, medical instruments, and other artifacts. Professor Dandona will undertake this research as part of her current book project.

### Piotr Szyhalski: We Are Working All the Time!

The Weisman's survey exhibition, **PIOTR SZYHALSKI: WE ARE WORKING ALL THE TIME!**, features works in a variety of media across three decades of Szyhalski's prolific and pioneering practice, including poster design, web projects, mail art, painting, installation, and public performance. The exhibition will

include a number of artist-led "activations" in and around WAM, with moments of performance, printmaking, and in-gallery "office hours" by Szyhalski on select Fridays from August 20th to December 31st.
