Parking Card Refund Program

With the new parking system rollout for fall 2022, the previous stored value cards (SVC) will no longer be used. MCAD community members who have purchased an SVC in the Art Cellar can turn in the card for a refund for the remaining value if the following stipulations are met:

The SVC must be readable by the parking system card scanner in the Business Office. The refund amount will be determined by what the card scanner reads as the remaining value on the SVC. Any cards that come back as invalid, expired, unreadable, etc. will not be eligible for a refund. Students, staff, and faculty may turn in SVC's to the Business Office during these hours:

- Tue-Thur 9/13 - 9/15 from 10:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.
- Tue-Thur 9/20 - 9/22 from 10:30 a.m.- 3:30 p.m.
- Tue-Thur 9/27 - 9/29 from 10:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

Refunds will be given in cash at the time the card is turned in. Please be ready to show your current MCAD ID. Parking card refunds will not be processed after September 29, 2022.
