

Arlene Birt, Faculty Biennial Forum Lectures, September 19, 2024

As an information designer involved with an IPCC report and creating numerous other social and environmental visuals through her company, Background Stories, Birt shares the challenges and opportunities of designing visuals in global collaborative spaces: In environments where the 'messiness' of the creative design process must flex to accommodate multiple rounds of iteration, collaboration, and the mandated UN procedures. We'll explore processes and techniques to find agreement in collaborations where the precise wording of science conflicts with evolving creative flow.

Gerald Ronning, Faculty Biennial Forum Lectures, September 26, 2024

Gerald Ronning presented his paper "Who Built the Clouds?: Prince's Guitars and Questions of Authorship" at the 2024 Annual CCA meeting. The paper considers the ways that authorship has been constructed in the case of Prince's custom-made Cloud guitars. Ronning argues in the case of these guitars history has been erased in the process of mythologizing the artist and in the subsequent transformation of artifacts into relics.

Faculty Biennial, August 26-November 2, 2024

Throughout the fall, the gallery will spotlight the art and research undertaken by both full- and part-time faculty in the 2024 MCAD Faculty Biennial. Some fifty faculty members in the college's Creative Entrepreneurship, Design, Fine Arts, Media Arts, and Liberal Arts departments will be participating in an exhibition in the Main and Concourse Galleries. Participating faculty will also be presenting papers, film screenings, performances, and readings as part of a Faculty Forum Series in Auditorium 140.

In 2024 the Visual Arts Fund will award \$60,000 (six \$10,000 grants) to artist-organized projects in the Twin Cities metro region. The VAF supports the development of projects and initiatives that engage the public with visual art happening outside of established arts venues. Submissions are due Saturday, September 28 by 5:00 pm CDT.

Campus Safety Escort Boundary

Campus Safety Escorts are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week within the approved escort boundary and as department staffing levels permit. <u>Confluence: An East Lake Studio for Community Design</u> invites interested MCAD students to apply for its Autonomous Request for Proposals (A-RFP) to Re-imagine the former site of the Minneapolis Police Department's Third Precinct building.

The A-RFP accepts proposals in written, audio and/video format through a submission platform. **Proposals will be accepted from May 25, 2024 to September 27th, 2024**. Open in three application tiers, finalists will be chosen by Third Precinct Patrol Zone neighbors, each awarded \$1,500 to collaborate together towards a shared, collaborative vision.
