Khendum has a Ph.D. in Information Systems Technology from Indiana University Bloomington. Her background intersects the marriage of Technology, Design and Education. She has a grounded understanding of theories of learning, developing online education, innovating hybrid, and face-to-face instructional programs, and collaborating on curriculum design with educators and community leaders in a variety of teaching and learning contexts, at both the international and national level. Khendum's knowledge and professional experience positions her to scope out the nuances existing in any system of human development. She is adept at facilitating curriculum mapping workshops, leading the design and evaluation of graduate and undergraduate academic programs. She has a long history of facilitating faculty learning in higher education, and has also designed and facilitated workshops, academies and talks for K-12 teachers, health care workers and community stakeholders in the U.S, Bhutan, Nepal and Papua New Guinea.

Ben Bowman Monday, October 4 noon-1:00 p.m. Aud 150 or join on <u>Zoom</u>

Ben Bowman is a filmmaker and educator who specializes in online learning. He collaborates closely with faculty, students and administrators to design innovative online programs. Prior to working as the Senior Associate Director of the Learning Science Lab at New York University's Stern School of Business, Bowman ran the faculty teaching grant program at Stern's W.R. Berkley Innovation Labs, where he developed a practice of creating inclusive, accessible, and effective learning experiences. He previously led the

online instructional design team at Yeshiva University in New York City.

Bowman's feature film Knucklehead (AMC Networks/RLJ) a mental health themed drama set in Brooklyn's housing projects, premiered at the Brooklyn Academy of Music in 2015 and earned film festival awards across North America. Bowman's first film, Second Story Man (Twin Cities Public Television) is about the racial politics and media representations of the legendary Minneapolis Green Chair Project. The premiere screening was held at MCAD. Bowman is a recipient of the McKnight Foundation sponsored Minnesota Independent Film Fund (2002).

Bowman earned an MFA in film from the NYU Tisch School of the Arts, where he also taught for two years. A product of the Minneapolis Public School system, he holds a BA, with distinction, in Studio Art (painting) from Hamline University. Bowman taught film directing for two years at Trinity College in Connecticut. He has lectured at NYU, Hampton University, and the Harvard Graduate School of Design.

Melissa Williams (she/her) grew up in Arkansas and moved to Minneapolis in 1998 to pursue a Ph.D. in American Studies, specializing in 20th century American mass media, at the University of Minnesota. She instantly fell in love with the Twin Cities, and later with online learning, as the Instructional Technology Fellow for her graduate program. Committed to her adopted hometown(s) and to the democratizing potential of online learning, Dr. Williams opted to forego the national academic job market, instead advising and adjuncting before moving into instructional design full time in 2014. She has worked with and learned from a wide variety of Twin Cities institutions, including public, private, community, and graduate schools of all sizes.

Dr. Williams is most proud of her accessibility and Universal Design for Learning (UDL) work. When at Mitchell Hamline School of Law, she led an initiative to systematically overhaul the college's document accessibility. She later wrote a successful grant to bring Ally, an innovative accessibility tool, to Century College—the first school in the Minnesota State system to utilize this tool. She currently teaches webinars and facilitates workshops on both accessibility and UDL, advocating for its use as a path to equity in education.

Dr. Williams is dedicated to community engagement, specifically around food justice. As a St. Paul District 12 Community Councilmember and co-chair of the council's Equity Committee, she co-wrote the council's Equity Framework and fostered food-related initiatives in her community, often partnering with the co-op her spouse has managed for almost two decades. In her free time, she likes to enjoy the incredible outdoor offerings of the Twin Cities with her family.

Arlene Birt, Associate Professor and Interim Chair, Arts Entrepreneurship: An 'aha!' moment is a sudden insight or discovery: a revelation. It is a spark of clarity that can inspire action. The 'aha!' is part emotional experience, part clarity of information, and part new understanding – often emerging from a personal perspective.

To inspire response to our climate crisis, we need to provoke more 'aha!' moments.

Using data as source material, this series of projects explore opportunities for 'aha' moments by putting climate-related data into context. I strive to help people develop emotional connection to seemingly distant topics by translating complex ideas into meaningful experiences. Transforming abstract concepts and digital data into tangible encounters –making the invisible, visible– I aim to help each of us see our role in the bigger picture.

### Chromosphere: The Color Theory Podcast, by Ed Charbonneau

Ed Charbonneau, Adjunct Faculty, Fine Arts, hosts this podcast, which presents a series of conversations about color, color usage, and optics as they relate to theories of human color perception in the making of visual art and design.

Weekly episodes, released each Tuesday, will focus on a range of topics, such as the properties of light and color vision; the many primary colors (red, green, blue, yellow, cyan and magenta); Is Indigo the Pluto of Hues? - Sir Isaac Newton and the visible spectrum; Mary Gartside and the Colour Ball; coding efficiency and the use of value contrasts as focal points; and chromostereopsis - how human depth perception may contribute to chromatic focal points.
