 - This report only shows student legal names. It does NOT show students institutionally recognized names and IT is unable to update that report.
- Faculty Info > Class List Institutionally Recognized Names & Pronouns
 - This report DOES show students institutionally recognized names, as well as legal names, and is meant to be used in conjunction with the other list.

IT has made this second report much more noticeable, as a bright colored button, on the Faculty tab in <u>MyMCAD</u>.

Forecast Public Artist Grants

Forecast grants support Minnesota-based individual early- and mid-career artists looking to advance their work in public art. They seek to fund a diverse group of artists working in all career stages and ranges of public art practices and media and place particular emphasis on supporting and amplifying the artistic work of BIPOC and Native artists, LGBTQIA+ artists, womxn artists, immigrant artists, artists from rural communities, and artists with disabilities.

It is their value that their applicants, panelists, and grantees reflect the racial, cultural, gender, artistic, physical ability, and geographic diversity of Minnesota and the 11 Native Nations that share the same geography, and the stories and perspectives of the artists and communities they serve.

The 2024 grant cycle application period is open through October 16, 2023.

Kathryn Savage (Assistant Professor, Liberal Arts) will participate in a special panel discussion about searching for difficult joy, in life and in writing, hosted by Milkweed Editions at Milkweed Books. Poet Michael Bazzett will lead a talk featuring guest writers Savage, Danez Smith, and Mairead Small Staid. The event is free and open to the public. The theme of the conference was writing about place and the environment.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 9-27-23

We began with a check-in around the room. We discussed edits to the Academic-Year Appointment policy and finalized the draft for Cabinet approval. As we continue to prepare for the HLC Reaffirmation, Jim and Melissa shared details related to the need to have faculty credentials on file. This includes transcripts from the institution where they obtained their highest degreed or, if faculty do not possess a terminal degree, the process for evaluating professional experiences for equivalency. We have a form to help with this process and Jim is available to provide support or answer questions. We continued our discussion of a process for co-teaching. The institutional assessment webpage appears to have old program learning outcomes and all program leaders need to review these, letting Jim know if updates need to be made. As a reminder, the course planning dates were shared again.

Cabinet 10-4-23

We began with a check-in around the room. Jim reminded everyone again to review the program learning outcomes on the assessment webpage. Cabinet approved the Academic-Year Appointment policy. We discussed the Faculty Senate proposal for the creation of an Emeritus status for Adjunct Faculty. Further research will be completed and brought back to the group for discussion. A member of Cabinet asked the group how Gchat was being used institutionally - as they personally do not use Gchat and reference it infrequently, resulting in missed communication. Discord as a communication platform for class discussion was also raised. These subjects will be revisited. It was announced that MCAD was successful in securing an AICAD Arts & Wellbeing Micro-Grant for \$4,200 in support of an intergenerational creative project with MCAD's First Year Experience students and residents of the Pillars Senior Living Community in Minneapolis.

Call for Submissions: Presidential Correspondence Award

This competition is a chance for students to have their work featured on MCAD notecards, which the President, Sanjit Sethi, uses throughout the year to stay in touch with colleagues, supporters, and partners.
