

Campus Safety Escort Boundary

Campus Safety Escorts are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week within the approved escort boundary and as department staffing levels permit. Escorts can only be used for rides between the MCAD Main campus and the person's residence, parked vehicle, or bus stop/HourCar within the boundary range. We do not provide rides to or from a person's place of work. Escorts will be completed on foot when the escort is on or near campus. Escorts will not be given to or from bars, restaurants, grocery stores, medical appointments, etc.

Re/Designing Democracy - Resources for Discussing Democracy with Your Students

The American Association of Colleges and Universities invites you to watch "Re/Designing Democracy," a free webinar hosted by AAC&U's Institute for Democracy & Higher Education (IDHE). The hour-long webinar is centered around Democracy Re/Designed, a national effort to encourage classroom and campus discussions about envisioning a democracy that works for everyone. IDHE Executive Director Nancy Thomas reviews how and why Democracy Re/Designed came to be and how this framework can help facilitate these discussions.

Center for Artistic Activism

On Monday, May 13th, the Center for Artistic Activism presented <u>Creative Civic Learning: Faculty-Led Ideas to Strengthen Democracy in 2024</u>, a special online event in partnership with Project Pericles. Featuring Faculty Fellows from the Unstoppable Voters program and Project Pericles, the event focused on how Fellows have overcome student apathy, partnered with community organizations, and implemented creative civic work in unexpected disciplines to have a huge impact on young voters' lives.

ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 10-2-24

We began with a check-in around the room. Periodically, we will have presentations on academic program changes given the large number of curricular and program changes that have been undertaken by program leaders and faculty. To this end, we started with Creative Entrepreneurship. Olaf Kuhlke, Chair of Creative Entrepreneurship, presented how things have been going and also reminded everyone of the many learning opportunities, including studio electives, in Creative Entrepreneurship for all of our students. Jim reminded all program leaders to review current curriculum maps and to make updates for anything that has changed. We also discussed Institutional Learning Outcomes and Jim presented possible ways to assess them. The Target Advancing Design Diversity Mentorship program is moving forward and we asked that all leaders share this terrific opportunity for our students. The program will pair each student with a Target staff member for mentor once-a-month meetings from October to May.

Cabinet 10-9-24

We began with a check-in around the room, and then with some updates including gratitude to all program leaders for carefully reviewing the spring curriculum and the number of courses offered in each discipline. ELC has worked with the board to close the financial gap with no significant impact on programs. AICAD PALS is Oct. 17-19, with a public conversation, *Visualizing Sustainable Futures*, on Oct. 18 at 7:00 p.m. in Auditorium 150 and all are encouraged to attend. The Target Advancing Design Diversity Mentorship program received 26 applications and 15 students were awarded a seat in the program which runs from October to May and includes a \$950 stipend for each participant. There appears to be some confusion around the new attendance policy and all program leaders were encouraged to help clarify for faculty and students during meetings and/or town halls. We are beginning a process for departmental analysis so that we can align budgets with disciplinary needs. The remainder of the meeting was a presentation on AI, *The Artists' Control of Consent: Ethics and Solutions*, by Kurt Paulsen, MAGWD Faculty.
