ACADEMIC CABINET AND CURRICULUM MEETINGS

Curriculum 10-12-23

We began with a check-in around the room. We reviewed parameters related to course laptop eligibility. Jim presented on internship registration processes for students and guidance from Career Development. He then led a discussion on ongoing assessment work and a form that will be sent to all program leaders to ascertain how their work last year has informed adjustments or changes being considered or implemented this year. A reflection on the excellent work conducted the last three years in all programs that led to MCAD successfully removing interim monitoring for assessment by HLC, our accreditation body. The merit scholarship and Van Derlip award processes were discussed and all program leaders were invited to review them and make suggestions for improving or streamlining them to improve the experience for students and faculty.

Cabinet 10-18-23

We began with a check-in around the room. We reviewed a draft Adjunct Emeritus proposal which led to a determination that we should move away from emeritus status upon retirement and instead craft something that honors long serving adjuncts. A revision is underway. We discussed a proposed fraternization policy related to faculty and student interactions. A rich discussion ensued and additional work revising is

underway. This will eventually be brought to faculty in each department for input. The meeting concluded with undergraduate department chairs and directors reviewing faculty sabbatical proposals and recommending approval of this year's applicants to the VPAA.
