PRIORITY DEADLINES

Fall 2021 Course Withdrawals Due Friday, November 12 at 5:00 p.m.

This is a final reminder that the deadline to withdraw from Fall Semester 2021 courses is Friday, November 12 at 5:00 p.m. If you know of any students who still need to withdraw from your course(s), please reach out to them and remind them to do so before the deadline. Student Alerts are also an acceptable way to notify them regarding withdrawal recommendations. Students will submit course withdrawal forms through myMCAD. GTA Requests for Spring

To request a student from the MFA program as a graduate teaching assistant (GTA) work-study for your class, submit this <u>form</u>. All MCAD full-time and adjunct faculty are welcomed to fill out this request form. This form must be filled out every semester in order to be considered to have a GTA for your course. GTAs are not guaranteed to all who request one (if there is a high-volume of requests).

All requests are due by 5:00 p.m. Central Time on Monday, November 15, 2021. Faculty who have submitted a Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) Request will hear back from Ellen Mueller, MFA Director, before Winter Break begins. In collaboration with Financial Aid, we will work to assign teaching assistantships with faculty that are within their discipline, and within the student's education/career goals.

GTA work can begin work as early as 2 weeks before the start of classes, and must end by the last day of classes for the semester (May 10, 2022). GTAs can work 10-12 hours per week depending on when they start working for you.
