Re-Source Circles (RSC) With Molly Jane Sturges:

As a community of carers supporting students at this time many of us are stretched beyond our comfort and abilities. Resourcing ourselves, supporting one another, and knowing how to support students can be challenging - and increasingly emergent. As the needs that our students bring into the classroom shift, we are learning and adapting in our own way. At times, this can be overwhelming and may thwart our ability to bring the best out of ourselves. Many have experience training sessions on the ABCs of trauma informed education and other topics. Some tools and practices stick, while others disappear. In the spirit of taking steps towards supporting a learning and culture of care that can adapt and grow in such challenging times consider joining artist-educator-activist, depth facilitator and wellbeing coach Molly Sturges in an experiential workshop focusing on Re-Source Circles. These are two simple forms that tend to lift inherent collective wisdom, cultivate shared learning, and cultivate authentic meaningful connection and support. There will be time to address specific questions around current challenges in our learning communities/classes.

Moren's project, Changing Climate, addresses the most critical issue of our time. He is a media artist who uses filmmaking, performance, sculpture, sound, and custom software to capture and reframe the environment, questioning anthropocentric viewpoints.
