There are many things on your mind this week. For your work at MCAD, I ask you to concentrate on teaching and your class content. You will have questions about important academically related and college-wide issues. I will continue to update you as PAC and Cabinet works though these.

Even though we may not see each other in the hallways, we are still a vibrant community, and we are here to help. My thoughts are with all of you at this time.
